

Week 1: September 10-15

Lesson 1: Humility Is Thinking About What Is Best For Others!

- 1. Intro
 - a. We are studying Humility this season!
 - b. We have a new Character Declaration! Memorizing our declaration can help you become a man or woman of *true character* by training your heart with true thoughts to think.
 - i. Proverbs 4:23 "Guard your heart above all else, for it is the source of life." (HCSB)
 - c. God created each of you with a mission! I want to help you build the character you need succeed in that life mission.
 - d. Our declaration question this season is:

"How do you practice humility?"

"I think about what is best for others all the time."

e. What does God have to say about Humility? A lot! The Bible is God's words, his message to us. We're going to memorize this message from God this season:

"So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time he will lift you up in honor."

Lesson 2: Humility Is Good

2. Pride vs. Humility

- a. Who do you spend the most time thinking about:
 - i. YOU- you probably spend most of your thoughts on

 - 3. I am tired, hungry, angry, happy, sad. I want... I wish I had...
- b. Is thinking about yourself all the time pride, or humility?
- c. Pride is thinking about yourself all the time; thinking you are the most important, thinking you are better than others. Pride is sneaky. You will never accidentally be humble, only proud.

3. So What is Humility?

- a. Pride is, "Me first." Humility allows us to say, "No, you first, my friend."
- b. Sometimes people think that humility means thinking badly about yourself. This is not true. Humility does not think you are worthless.
- c. Humility believes that **all** people are valuable. (Both you **and** others.)
- d. Some people think humility will stop you from winning or being successful. But if you win because you pushed yourself to the front, you will never have peace and love.
- e. Humility, believing that the other person is important, is needed in all your relationships!
- f. Real humility is seeing a bigger picture than yourself. If you could look down from an airplane, you might see that you are not very big or important. There are billions of people on the earth. All of them have needs & wants.
- g. What is amazing is that God created each person, knows all about them and cares for them. We should remember that *everyone* is important, and spend less time thinking about ourselves.
- h. The Bible teaches us over and over that pride is dangerous:
 - i. Too much pride can put you to shame. It's wiser to be humble. Proverbs 11:2
 - ii. Pride precedes destruction; an arrogant spirit appears before a fall. Better to be humble among the poor, than to share what is stolen with the proud. Proverbs 16:18-19
- i. Humility is good:

i. **True humility and fear of the LORD lead to riches, honor, and long life.** Proverbs 22:4

4. Review Story (Part 1)

- a. The farmer buys a new rooster, "Royboy", to guard his flock of 30 hens. Royboy arrives at the farm and demands to be called "Royal". He immediately spends his time looking in the mirror and yelling at the chickens and Horse. He demands they lay eggs and not bother him.
- b. One chicken, Henrietta, is especially shy and worried about how she measures up. She hides towards the back.

5. Application

a. Humility is believing that every person is important. It is having an accurate view of your own strengths and weaknesses and focusing on how to help others.

Week 4: October 1-6

1. Review

Lesson 4: I Am Important Because God Cares For Me

2. Review Story (Part 2)

a. The flock of hens are now a scared and worried mess because of Royal. He has demanded their eggs be laid by 6:40 am and be nearly perfect, or else. Henrietta is so worried she pecks some of her feathers out. Horse tries to calm and comfort the flock. In the morning, Royal begins his "inspections", pecks open any eggs that don't meet his standards, and makes fun of the hens. Henrietta has not even laid an egg. Royal attempts to peck her head, but Horse saves her by putting his nose in the way.

3. What does our verse teach us?

- a. Think about the words in our verse to answer these questions:
- b. What will God do? Lift you up in honor (Make you look good; Give you respect and dignity)
- c. When will God do this? At the right time
 - a. We don't know when this is! We trust in God's wisdom to know when.
- d. What do I need to do? Humble myself
 - i. Make myself lower
 - ii. Recognize that I am not most important
 - iii. Make others important
- e. Where should I humble myself? Under the mighty power of God.
 - i. How do we know God is powerful? How powerful is he?
 - 1. The Bible says he "created the heavens and the earth" out of nothing. Gen 1:1
 - 2. The Spirit of God "raised Jesus from the dead" Rom 8:11
 - 3. He can save us from our own sin. 2 Corinthians 5:17
- f. Why should I humble myself? Because God cares for me!
 - 1. The next verse in 1 Peter says "Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you."

4. Application

- a. Coach: Tell each of your students by name: "_____, you are important to God."
- b. Students: Tell someone else that they are important to God today! Bonus, tell someone outside of your group.

5. Wrap Up

a. God wants me to trust him. To believe that he will take care of me. To believe that I am important to him. When I really believe I am important to God, it will make me confident. I can be humble enough to treat others around me as important too.

Lesson 6: Pride is Me, Me, Me

2. Review Story (Part 3)

a. The Farmer is surprised and confused on what has happened to the chickens and Horse. He works to calm the chickens and tells Royboy he will need to fend off whatever intruder got in (not knowing it was Royboy himself!) The 30 chickens are now laying only 12 eggs a day because of their fear of Royal. They come up with a plan to keep a lookout for when Royal comes out of the barn so they can scatter, but when it is Henrietta's turn, she gets so caught up in her own fearful thoughts she doesn't see him coming and he injures three hens by pecking them.

3. Pride Is All About Me!

- a. To practice humility, we need to know how to watch out for the opposite- pride!
- b. Pride is focusing on me, me, me. I am proud when I think only about what I want & need, what makes me comfortable and happy.
 - i. Why is focusing on yourself prideful?
 - 1. When I focus on myself, I am not thinking of others.
 - 2. When I only think about me, I am spending my time and energy on only me.
 - 3. When I only think about myself, I am acting like I am more important than others.
 - ii. What happens when everyone tries to be first?

- c. Pride is thinking that I don't need others:
 - i. I don't need help, I have everything figured out
 - ii. I don't want to be told what to do
 - iii. I don't need God. I can do whatever I want

2. Review Story (Part 4)

a. The barnyard is a fear filled place now. The farmer sadley tells Horse that he may have to butcher the chickens if they don't lay more eggs. Royal overhears and is happy to think of being without the hens, however, Horse quickly tells him that without the hens he has no purpose, "Selfish creatures end up alone." The salesman from the store stops by and tells the farmer he should butcher Royal instead of the hens because he is causing all the problems. Royal hears and faints.

3. Obvious Pride Versus Humility

- a. Some pride is very obvious to others, and sometimes pride is something hidden that we can't see easily. Today we're talking about obvious pride.
- b. Here are some examples of obvious pride, and what humility looks like instead. Which of these statements describe you?

 - i. Royal has "exalted' himself, trying to make himself look better than everyone else. And now he has fallen to the dirt, broken his leg, and everyone is happy he is gone.

 - a. Remember God cares about you! Trust that he will take care of you as you think about others.

3. Review Story (Part 5)

a. Royal dreams of being the greatest rooster in his own Kingdom, but awakes to having fallen and broken his leg. The farmer kindly cares for Royal and takes him to the vet. The hens wonder where he has gone, but are mostly pleased to be without him. They begin laying more eggs again. The vet returns with Royal in a leg splint, telling the farmer that Royal has been a gentle patient. The farmer cares for him in his own kitchen until his leg has healed and then brings him back to the barnyard. Meanwhile, Henrietta is still thinking about how much of a disgrace she is to the flock.

Week 12: December 3-8

Lesson 12: Humility Is Happy

2. Review Story (Part 6)

a. Royal nervously re-enters the the barnyard. The hens scatter, but soon return to investigate Royal because he is so different. All except Henrietta, she runs away and is not noticed until the hens are put in for the night. Royal surprises the hens by crying over the missing Henrietta, stating that it was his fault. At dawn, Royal goes with Horse to look for Henrietta. They find her cold and still at the creek, but manage to take her back to the barn, and with care from Royal and Horse, revive her. Royal now insists on being called Royboy, sings funny songs, guards all the hens, and shares his food. Henrietta hides her eggs, but is surprised when one day they hatch! Royboy no longer looks in the mirror.

3. Humility helps us find happiness

- a. Here is a quote from C.S. Lewis to help us think about humility.
- b. "Do not imagine that if you meet a really humble [person] he will be what most people call 'humble' nowadays: he will not be a sort of greasy, smarmy person, who is always telling you that, of course, he is nobody.
 - Probably all you will think about him is that he seemed a cheerful, intelligent chap who took a real interest in what you said to him.
 - If you do dislike him it will be because you feel a little envious of anyone who seems to enjoy life so easily. He will not be thinking about humility: he will not be thinking about himself at all."
- c. Being humble will help us be happy. Why? Because we won't be focused on ourselves! Focusing on serving others is a much more effective way to be happy in life.
- d. The more you try to make yourself happy by focusing on yourself, the more unhappy you will be.

4. Application

- a. Coach: Pray for your students that God will help us believe that humility will make us happy instead of pride.
- b. "Father in heaven, please help us believe that you care for each one of us. Help us to trust you by treating others around us as more important. We know that you are powerful and will honor us at the right time if we trust you."
